Highlights from the Rotary International Conference in Calgary:

Kimberly, Guy, and Ellen attended the 2025 Rotary International (RI) Convention in Calgary, Canada, held from June 21-25, along with 15,000 Rotarians from 140 countries. The convention included inspiring general sessions with thousands in attendance, small group talks on service projects, and a House of Friendship with hundreds of booths displaying Rotary's humanitarian projects, partner organizations, and fellowship opportunities. We connected with the Ak'Tenamit school in Guatemala, joined

Rotary Action Groups, and got a lot of great ideas for new service projects, including working with schools to reduce food waste, a lithium-ion battery recycling event, a "purple pinky" project to raise funds for polio eradication, and tree-planting projects. Attending a Rotary convention allows one to see the big picture and makes one proud to be part of it. The 2026 convention is in Taipei, Taiwan from June 13-17.

Plastic Free July: The Environment is one of the Rotary Areas of Focus highlighted at the Calgary Conference. The "Plastic Free July" project teaches us that we can reuse items instead of taking things that will be used once and thrown away.
